It is synonymous with the enduring understanding or big idea.</p>	<p><b>Thinking Skills &amp; Performances</b></p> <p>A performance that is required to show an understanding of the Concepts, which may include critical thinking and learning to learn</p>

<p><b>Learning Experiences</b></p> <p>Classroom and other activities that support learning virtues, concepts, content and skills. This is an overview of the daily or weekly lessons and might include discussion, lectures, research, role-play, practical experiments, multimedia demonstrations, research activities, presentations, critical analysis, etc.</p>
